COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS was one of my grandma's favorite hymns. Some of you may know it by heart, but let me share some of the words with you.

When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed,

When you are discouraged thinking all is lost,

Count your many blessings, name them one by one,

And it will surprise you what the Lord hath done.

So, amid the conflict whether great or small,

Do not be discouraged, God is over all.

Count your many blessings, angels will attend,

Help and comfort give you to your journey's end.

We are certainly living in a time where everyone is feeling *tempest tossed* and *discouraged*. And it is true that we need to count our blessings, remembering all the good that is in the world and all the wonderful things God has done.

I have noticed the "Blessing Box" (or is it a jar?) at the church, and I like the idea of sharing our blessings with others. Since the church is still "closed" and many of us are spending most of our time at home, I would like to encourage you to make a blessing *container* of your own. It doesn't have to be fancy. Maybe you have a shoe box or a bowl from your kitchen where you can collect small bits of paper with the things for which you are grateful written on them. Or maybe you just want to keep a list on a note pad.

Whenever you encounter something that makes you smile or brightens your day, write it down.

Then when we're visiting with a friend or relative on the phone, over the fence, or by email, we could share our blessings with one another to lift our spirits. This can also be an easy and inspiring way to share your faith – to acknowledge God's goodness and God's activity in our lives.

This is also a good time for us to begin a project that was brought to us at our last Session meeting by Jeanie Dale. Included in this newsletter, you will find a form titled, **Prayer Partners**. We are asking for members of Westminster and First who would like to participate to complete the form and send it back to their church. Each person will be matched with someone from the other church. The information you provide will be shared with your prayer partner, allowing us to get to know one another and giving some guidance on how to personalize our prayers for the other.

Eventually, the partners may want to communicate by email or phone. This will allow us to get to know the other congregation better while we are unable to have joint worship services and activities.

I count every one of you as a blessing in my life, and I am in prayer for you. Our spirits are bound together in the Holy Spirit.
