WE ARE AN EASTER PEOPLE... and Alleluia is our Song!

Some attribute this beautiful expression to St. Augustine; others to Pope John Paul II. Wherever it came from, it is certainly memorable and admirable.

I don't remember where I first heard it, but I've had it memorized ever since. It is a good reminder that Easter is not just one day. Easter is a season that continues for 6 more Sundays. Furthermore, I try to remember that *every* Sunday is a "little Easter." Because Jesus was resurrected on a Sunday, Christians worship on Sunday.

Easter is an attitude.

While suffering and death is real and not to be denied, the Christian church was founded by those who believed that Jesus was raised from the dead. Through all of our struggles and trials, all the suffering and death around us, there is always HOPE because of Easter.

New life is real. Forgiveness is real. Transformation is real. Resurrection is real. God's love is real and always available to us throughout our life, death, and into eternity. Death will not have the last word. Death is not the end. As we acknowledge and witness the suffering and death Jesus endured, our celebration of resurrection will be that much more joyous.

So, I pray that you will worship with us IN PERSON at First Presbyterian Church, Maundy Thursday, April 1, 7:00 pm. Communion will be served, and this service will also be available online.

Worship on Good Friday, April 2, is online only at 12:00 noon.

Our Easter celebration, with communion, will be at our normal worship time: 9:15 am, Sunday, April 4.

Beyond our worship, may we strive to be EASTER PEOPLE every day, sharing hope, forgiveness, and God's everlasting love, especially with those who are suffering. And may Alleluia be our song.
